In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833.

George Davis of Buffalo New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a citizen with George Cook of Buffalo N.Y., an

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the *Excelsior* whereof Alexander Waffle is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Meau Ohio in the year 1847 as appears by the Enrollment dated

at said port April 9th 1848 and numbered (12) Keeler now *Excelsior* having changed name And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is One hundred & twenty four feet and four inches 112 ft All, her breadth Twenty four feet 24 " " her depth Ten feet 10 " " and that she measures Two hundred & fifty tons fifty five ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner and has a screw head

And the said George Davis agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
