In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 13th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

Daniel F. Monroe of Craig Chauteaugus Co., New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Con: Bramcy whereof Daniel F. Monroe is at present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Selow Creek New York in the year 1843, as appears by His Enrollment dated at this Port the eighteenth day of May 1849. and numbered fifty four (44)

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and two masts and that her length is sixty four feet and one inch her breadth fourteen feet and one inch her depth seven feet and that she measures Eighty tons seventy and that she is a Schooner has no galley and a head

And the said Daniel F. Monroe having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
