In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1837; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for securing the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.
Leander W. Mixer of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken and subscribed the Oath required by said Act, and having sworn that he together with Harry M. Mixer ^{of Buffalo N.Y.} are the owners each of one undivided half of the schooner Francis that they are

Citizens of the United States, and ^{the sole} owners of the said schooner ^{or} Vessel called the Francis whereof Franklin Menard of Irving N.Y. is also present Master, and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Huron Ohio in the year 1849 as appears by her enrollment dated at this port August 7th 1850 & numbered 671 (Twenty one) now surrendered having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is Eighty one feet 81 feet her breadth Twenty feet & six inches 20 1/2 feet her depth Eight feet 8 inches and that she measures one hundred Twenty tons Thirty two hundred and fifty, that she is a schooner has a square Stern and a scroll head

And the said Leander W. Mixer having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
