In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

George B. Walbridge, of Buffalo, Erie County, N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he together with John Minton of the same place are the owners of the Steam Boat called the Albany, that said George B. Walbridge owns four fifths (4/5) of said Vessel and that said John Minton owns one fifth (1/5) of said Vessel, and that both of said owners

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Albany, of Buffalo whereof John Minton, is also present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Detroit Michigan in the year 1846, as appears by her Enrollment, dated at this Port, May 5, 1848, Numbered 32, Now Surrendered having changed owner.

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has One Deck and Two masts and that her length is Two hundred and Two feet 2 1/2 feet her breadth Twenty nine feet 29 inches her depth Eleven feet and eight inches 11 feet 8 inches and that she measures Six hundred & Sixty nine tons Thirty six ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no galley and no scull head

And the said George B. Walbridge having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
