Ohio in 1832, and rebuilt in 1844, in the year 1841 as appears by the Record of her last Enrollment in this office dated 8th June 1850. Numbered 50. (see affidavit of Michael Galligan re: lost papers, on file in this office) now surrendered having changed owners.

and a small _____ head And the said Michael Galligan _____ having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
