In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850. —
Amos Pratt, of Buffalo, New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and ^{sole} owner of the Steam Boat — or Vessel called the "Columbia" of Buffalo — whereof Amos Pratt is also present Master; and as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Fairport, Ohio in the year 1848 as appears by her Enrollment, dated at

Cleveland, Ohio 17th Augt, 1848. No. 116. Now surrendered having changed owner

And the said Enrollment — having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has — Iron Deck and one Mast and that her length is One hundred and Seventeen feet — 117 feet her breadth Eighteen feet and Six inches — 18 " Six her depth Eight feet and Two inches — 8 " 2 " and that she measures One hundred twenty eight tons fifty four — ninety-fifths; that she is a Steam Boat — has a Square Stern —

And the said Amos Pratt — having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
