having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with John P. Smith & Abel B. Smith, constituting the firm of Smith, Brothers, of Buffalo, are each owner of One equal undivided and third part of the Schooner "Niipanni," of Buffalo, and that all of said owners are

Citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the "Niipanni" of Buffalo whereof S. W. Winchese

is at present Master, and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Lyme, N.Y. in 1837

and built in New York in the year 1846 as appears by her Enrollment, dated at at this Port 13. April 1849. No 24, now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that

the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that

her length is One hundred feet 100 feet

her breadth Twenty feet six inches 20 " 6 "

her depth Eight feet six inches 8 " 6 "

that she is a Schooner has a Galley and Square Stern

having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
