In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838; also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Watson A. Fox of Buffalo, New York,
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Elijah W. Bruce, composing the firm of Fox & Bruce of Buffalo, N.Y. are owners of one equal undivided one half part of the Steam Boat "Great Western" of Buffalo; that Henry J. Smith, David M. Van Valkenburg, Robert A. Stevens and Charles S. Mack, composing the firm of H. J. Smith & Co. of Tonawanda, Caledonia, N.Y. are the owners of one equal undivided one half part of said Vessel, and that all of said owners are

Citizens of the United States, and owners of the Steam Boat — "Vessel called the "Great Western" of Buffalo — whereof Demitt C. Goldsmith is at present Master; and as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Newark, Ohio in the year 1838, as appears by her Enrollment, dat. 1st

Cleveland, Ohio 7th Sept. 1850. N^o 57. Her name is Lucy, having changed District name

And the said Enrollment, — having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has — one Deck and one Mast, and that her length is One hundred and eighty six feet — 18 1/2 feet her breadth Thirty four feet and four inches — 3 1/2 1/2 " her depth Thirteen feet — 13 " and that she measures Seven hundred eighty tons — ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat — has a figure —

And the said Watson A. Fox — and — head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
