In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Charles W. Smith of Buffalo, New York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that, he together with John S. Smith and Abel B. Smith, Composing the firm of Smith, Brothers, of Buffalo, are owners of one equal undivided one half part of the Brig "S. C. Wabridge" of Buffalo; that Charles Walker, Senior, and Charles Walker, Jr. Composing the firm of Walker & Son, of Chicago, Illinois, are the owners of one equal undivided half part of said Vessel, and that all of said owners are

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Brig or Vessel called the S. C. Wabridge whereof S. H. Green

is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Commerce

Ohio in the year 1844, as appears by her Enrollment dated at this Port 29th November, 1848, and Numbered 91, now owned and having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has one Deck and Two Masts and that her length is one hundred and four feet, six and one half inches 114 ft 6 1/2 in her breadth Twenty five feet, three and one half inches 24 ft 3 1/2 in her depth Nine feet, Five and one half inches 9 ft 10 1/2 in and that she measures Two hundred Twenty Seven tons Seventy nine hundred and ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has no galleries and has a Small head

And the said Charles W. Smith having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
