having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that, he together with Jacob S. Sherman of Buffalo New York are each owners of the one equal undivided one half of the Schooner Etta of Buffalo and are

is also presents Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Silver Creek New York in 1841 & rebuilt in the year 1843 as appears by her Enrollment dated at this Port May 4th 1850 Number Twenty eight now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two masts and that her length is Eighty four feet & seven inches 84 ft. 7 in her breadth Nineteen feet & four inches 19 " 4 " her depth Six feet and four inches 6 " 4 " and that she measures Ninety four tons Seventy one and that she is a Schooner has No Gallies ninety-fifths.

And the said F. D. Harrison and head having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
