In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Jacob Inson of Buffalo N.Y.  
 having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is the owner of one fourth part of the Steam boat Buckeye State. That Ann R Cobb, <sup>of Buffalo N.Y.</sup> is the owner of other one fourth part of said Steamer and that the remaining one half thereof is owned by John P Philips of Cincinnati Ohio that each of said owners is a

Citizen of the United States, <sup>that they are the sole</sup> and owners of the said Steam boat or Vessel called the Buckeye State whereof Jacob Inson

is also presents Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cincinnati Ohio in the year 1850-1. as appears by her original enrollment dated at the Port of Cincinnati Ohio - July 15<sup>th</sup> 1851, numbered Thirty three (33) now surrendered having changed owners.

And the said original enrollment having certified that the said Steamer or Vessel has three decks and one mast. and that her length is Twenty seven feet and seven inches 27 ft 7 in her breadth Twenty three feet and seven inches 23 " 7 " her depth Fourteen feet and three inches 14 " 3 " and that she measures 1274 tons 17 ninety-fifths; that she is a Steamer has a square stern and Plain head

And the said Jacob Inson having agreed to the description and measurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamer has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
