Bruce, of the same place, is Copartners in Trade, under the name & style of Fox & Bruce, and the owners (partners in Common) of the whole of the Brig Lowell of Buffalo, and

Citizen of the United States, and owners of the Brig Lowell of Buffalo, whereof Richard Mon is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1848, as appears by her Enrollment, dated at this Port, 16th July 1852. And the said Enrollment having certified that, the said Brig or Vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is One hundred and Twenty one feet and Seven inches, — 121 ft. 7 in her breadth Twenty five feet and Two inches — 24. 2 in her depth Nine feet four and three fourth inches — 9. 4 3/4 and that she measures Two hundred fifty five tons Ninety — ninety-fifths, that she is a Brig has a Skull.

And the said Watson A. Fox, having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
