In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lines of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

George B. Walbridge of Buffalo, N.Y., by Wells D. Walbridge, his atty, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Act, and having sworn that he, with said Wells D. Walbridge, of Buffalo, N.Y., Composing the firm of Geo B. Walbridge & Co.

Citizen of the United States, and ^{owner} of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the "Diamond of Buffalo" — whereof John E. Huff

is at present Master; and as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1847, as appears by her Enrollment, dated at this Port 11 Nov. 1851, No 88, now surrendered having changed owners?

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has — One Deck, — and One mast — and that her length is One hundred and fifty one feet — 157 feet her breadth Twenty seven feet and six inches — 27 " 6 in her depth Nine feet and five inches — 9 " 5 " and that she measures three hundred thirty one tons & One — ninety-fifths, that she is a Steam Boat — has a Screw —

And the said George B. Walbridge, by his said Attorney, having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
