In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coastwise Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lines of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

John S. Johnson, of Buffalo, N.Y.

having taken and subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he, with Samuel J. Holley, of the same place, co-venturers in Trade, under the name and style of Holley & Johnson, are the owners, as tenants in Common, of the Schooner "Jane Louisa" of Buffalo and are

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the "Jane Louisa" of Buffalo whereof W. Wetmore

is the present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1842 as appears by her last Enrollment, dated Mammocety, 12<sup>th</sup> June 1846 No - Now surrendered having changed owners & District.

And the said last Enrollment, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two masts, and that her length is Eighty Three feet and seven inches 82 ft. 7 in her breadth Thirty feet and six inches 30 ft. 6 in her depth Eight feet and eight inches 8 ft. 8 in and that she measures One hundred & thirty one tons & thirty five hundredths that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and coppered

And the said John S. Johnson having agreed to the description and dimensions above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
