In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Charles L. Gager of Buffalo N.Y.  
 having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and <sup>sole</sup> owner of the Barque <sup>or Vessel called the</sup>  
 Canada <sup>whereof Charles L. Gager</sup>  
 is at present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Chippewa  
 and altered from a Steamboat into a Barque at Detroit Michigan in the year 1852  
 Canada West <sup>in the year 1847</sup> as appears by Copy of her last Enrollment  
 dated at Detroit 6 Sept 1849. with Affidavit of said Gager stating that said last  
 Enrollment License were lost. And the Certificate of C. L. Gager Shipwright on file in this office

And the Surveyor <sup>having certified that</sup>  
 the said Barque <sup>or Vessel</sup> has one <sup>and three</sup> Masts <sup>and that</sup>  
 her length <sup>is</sup> One hundred Ninety Six feet ten inches <sup>196 ft 10 in</sup>  
 her breadth <sup>is</sup> Twenty Nine feet and four inches <sup>29 " 4 "</sup>  
 her depth <sup>is</sup> Twelve feet <sup>12 " "</sup>  
 and that she measures <sup>is</sup> Six hundred Sixty <sup>thirty eight</sup> tons <sup>ninety-fifths</sup>  
 that she is a Barque <sup>has a</sup> Square Stern <sup>head</sup>  
 and a <sup>small</sup> <sup>head</sup>

And the said Charles L. Gager <sup>having</sup>  
 agreed to the description and dimensions above specified, and sufficient security  
 having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Barque  
 has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
