In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lines of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Cyrillus C. Bristol, of Buffalo, Erie County, New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and ^{sole} owner of the Schooner Schooner Robert Willis of Buffalo whereof Cyrillus C. Bristol is the present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo, New York in the year 1850, as appears by the Certificate of Vincent Redgeel Shipwright, on file in this Office

And the Samuel C. Walker, Surveyor having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two masts and that her length is One hundred and fifty two feet and two inches — 142 ft. 2" her breadth Twenty six feet and seven inches — 26 " 7" her depth Five feet and five inches — 10 " 5" and that she measures Three hundred thirty seven tons Eighty Six — ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and a figure head

And the said Cyrillus C. Bristol having agreed to the description and measurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
