# ENROLLMENT.

District of Buffalo Creek,  
Port of Buffalo.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licencing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Watson A. Hoy of Buffalo New York  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he, with Elijah W. Spruce of the same place, Copartners in Trade and as such are owners of 2/3 undivided parts of the Schooner Hoy of Buffalo N.Y.; that Isaac Phillips of Buffalo N.Y. is the owner of the remaining undivided 1/3 part of said vessel.

Citizens of the United States, and <sup>Sole</sup> owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Hoy of Buffalo whereof Isaac Phillips is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1852 as appears by the Certificate of Enrolment dated at this Port Oct 1<sup>st</sup> 1852. No. 114. Now Surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrolment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is One hundred & forty eight feet & nine inches 148 ft 9 in her breadth Twenty seven feet & three inches 27 ft 3 in her depth Ten feet and eight inches 10 ft 8 in and that she measures four hundred five tons & nine ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a Square Stem

And the said Watson A. Hoy <sup>and</sup> head having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
