In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

William N Gorsight of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is the owner of the equal undivided 3/4 part of the Steamer Troy and that Samuel Kitchin and Thad. W. Patchin of the same place are each the owners of 1/4 part of said vessel and that all of said owners are

Citizens of the United States, and ^{Sole} owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Troy of Buffalo whereof William N Gorsight

is the present Master, and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Maumee City Ohio in the year 1845 as appears by the Enrollment dated at

Toledo Ohio July 14. 1857. & No. 3. now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamer or Vessel has Two Decks and One Mast, and that her length is One hundred and eighty-two feet & six inches 182ft 6 in her breadth Twenty Seven feet & six inches 27 " 6 " her depth Eleven feet and four & 1/2 inches 11 " 4 1/2 and that she measures 546 tons 44— ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no Gallies and Scull head

And the said William N Gorsight — " — " — " having agreed to the description and measurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
