In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, ^{and the act of Aug 30, 1850, concerning the same,} also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

David R. Morse, of Buffalo, N.Y.,

having taken and subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with Rufus Johnson, of the same place, Comprising the firm of Morse & Johnson and the owners of the undivided three fourths parts of the Schooner Montgomery of Buffalo; that Michael Galligan, of the same place, is the owner of one undivided one quarter of said Vessel, and that all of said owners

Citizens of the United States, and ^{said} owners of the Schooner Montgomery of Buffalo, whereof Michael Galligan

is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleaveland and Ohio in the year 1847 as appears by her last Enrollment, dated at Cleaveland, Ohio, 15 July 1851, No. 32, now surrendered, having changed owners

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two masts, and that her length is One hundred and thirteen feet and two inches 113 ft. 2 in her breadth Twenty five feet and three inches 25 ft. 3 in her depth Nine feet, six and a half inches 9 ft. 6 1/2 in and that she measures 248 tons 51 ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and Scow head

And the said David R. Morse having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
