In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, ^{and also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.}

Ebenezer P. Dow, of Buffalo, New York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Brig or Vessel called the "St. Louis," of Buffalo, whereof Thomas G. Crosby is the present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Sandusky, N. Y. in 1835, and rebuilt at Buffalo in the year 1848 as appears by her last Enrollment, dated at this Port April 5, 1850, No. 39, now renewed, having changed name

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is One hundred and thirteen feet and eight inches 113 ft. 8 in her breadth Twenty four feet and seven inches 24 ft. 10 in her depth Eight feet and seven inches 8 ft. 10 in and that she measures 210 tons & 80 ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has a Seal

And the said Ebenezer P. Dow having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
