In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, ^{also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.}

Christian is ^{the} Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Lexington, Mich 1844, & built at Livingston, N.Y. in the year 1848 as appears by her last Enrollment, dated at this Port, 2d April 1852. No 54, New Smeeded hewing chawpet And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck, and two masts, and that her length is One hundred and twelve feet and two inches — 112 ft. 2 in. her breadth Twenty feet. — 20 " 0 " her depth Eight feet — 8 " 0 " and that she measures 168 — tons & 67 — ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner.

And the said William B. Mann, having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
