In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, <sup>the act of Aug 30. 1850 amending the same</sup> also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for receiving the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

George E. Washburn, of Buffalo, New York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and <sup>owner</sup> owner of the Brig Virginia or Vessel called the Brig Virginia of Buffalo whereof Charles A. Gardner is the present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Erie, Penn. in the year 1848 as appears by her Enrollment, dated

at this Port, 10 May, 1852. No 70. Now surrendered and having changed name

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is Eighty three feet and six inches 83 ft. 6 in her breadth Forty four feet and six inches 44 ft. 6 in her depth Nine feet 9 ft and that she measures One hundred and sixty tons thirty two ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has no galleries and a single head

And the said George E. Washburn having agreed to the description and measurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
