In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act ^{passed 30th June 1852} ~~entitled "An Act for the purpose~~ for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Pearl S. Steinberg, of Buffalo, New York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he, with, Levi H. Runnells, of Buffalo, N.Y., addis on Rice & Everett, Clerk of New York City, Composing the firm of P. S. Steinberg & Co. and the owners of one equal undivided 3/4 part, of the Propeller Saginaw; that George H. Boyant of Buffalo, N.Y., own the remaining one equal undivided 1/4 part of said vessel and as

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Propeller or Vessel called the Saginaw of Buffalo whereof James S. Mitchell, is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at the City in the year 1851 as appears by an Enrollment

Dated at this Port, 25 March, 1852. N^o. 24. Her name and having changed name

And the said Enrollment being certified that the said Propeller Vessel has One deck and one mast, and that her length is One hundred and fifty five feet and one inch 153ft. 1in her breadth Twenty six feet 26. 0" her depth Ten feet and eight inches 10. 8" and that she measures 407 tons 2/3 ninety-fifths that she is a Propeller has no galley

And the said Pearl S. Steinberg having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Propeller has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
