In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licencing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1853, ^{also an Act of Aug. 3, 1852, providing for the same} and also an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Harvey M. Mixer of Buffalo, New York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is the owner of One equal undivided one half part, and David Cook of Hamlet, Chenango Co. N.Y. is owner of the remaining one half part, and

Citizen of the United States, and ^{Sole} owner of the Schooner, Swank of Buffalo whereof David Cook is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1848, as appears by her last Enrollment, dated

at this Port, 8 April 1853. No. 48, her name and having changed name

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and trimasts, and that her length is One hundred and ten feet 110 feet her breadth Twenty five feet and nine inches 25. 9 and her depth Nine feet, three and one fourth inches 9. 3/4 and that she measures 237 tons & 50 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a Scow head

And the said Harvey M. Mixer having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
