In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam;" passed 7th July, 1838, also an Act, entitled "An Act, to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is owner of one half of the Schooner "Morning Star of Buffalo"; that Hugh McMillen, of the same place, own the remaining one half part, and we

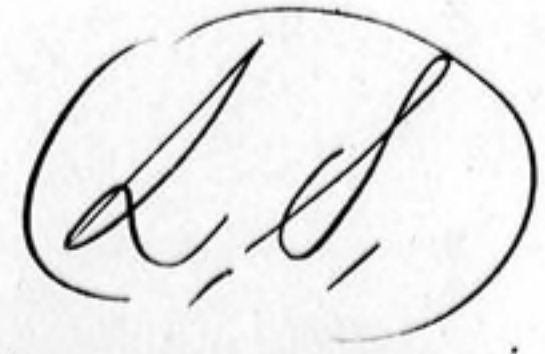
Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Schooner, or Vessel called the "Morning Star of Buffalo," whereof Henry V. Corbett is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Ashtabula Ohio in the year 1853 as appears by the Certificate of Wm. H. Hannan, Shipwright, on file in this office.

And the Lucian Hawley, Surveyor, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two masts, and that her length is Forty five feet and six inches 45 ft. 6 in her breadth Thirteen feet and nine inches 13 ft. 9 in her depth Three feet and eleven inches 3 ft. 11 in and that she measures 21 tons 9 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a round Stern and no figure head

And the said Henry V. Corbett, having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
