In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licencing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1834; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1853, and an Act, entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes" passed July 29, 1850.

Marshall O. Roberts, of New York City, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and owner of the Steamer _____ or Vessel called the _____ of the Port of Buffalo whereof D. A. Mc Bride is at present Master, and as he hath sworn _____ is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y.

in the year 1853 as appears by the Certificate of Vincent Bidwell Shipwright, dated July, 11 1853, and on file with this office.

And the Lucian Hawley, Surveyor, having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has One Deck and no masts, and that her length is Three hundred and Twenty four feet and four inches 324 ft. 4 in her breadth Fifty feet and two inches 40 ft. 2 in her depth Fourteen feet and seven inches 14 ft. 7 in and that she measures 1857 tons 30 ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat and no figure head

And the said D. A. Mc Bride, master of said Boat having agreed to the description and admeasurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
