In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Ferdinand C. Clark, Buffalo New York, Managing owner of the Barge called the Canada of Buffalo having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides in the city of Buffalo, District of Buffalo Creek and owns three undivided fourth parts of said Barge; that John S. Bantam resides at the same place and owns one undivided fourth part of said Barge, and that said owners are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Barge or Vessel called the Canada of Buffalo whereof said John S. Bantam is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Detroit State of Michigan in the year 1852, as appears by her last Enrollment, dated at this Port August 17th, 1852 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Barge or Vessel has One deck and three Masts and that her length is One hundred and ninety six feet and ten inches 196 feet 10 inches her breadth twenty nine feet and four inches 29 " 4 " her depth twelve feet 12 " 0 " and that she measures six hundred and sixty two thirty eight ninety-fifths that she is a Barge has a square Stern and a scroll head

And the said Ferdinand C. Clark and having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y.
