In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Henry C. Walker, Merchant, Buffalo, New York, Managing owner having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he is a resident of said Buffalo and with Grace C. Walker of the same place own as co-partners of the firm of H. C. Walker & Co three equal undivided fourth parts of the Bark Canada, and that John J. Bantam of the same place owns one equal undivided fourth part of said Bark and all said firms are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Bark Canada or Vessel called the Bark Canada of Buffalo whereof said Bantam is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Detroit State of Michigan in the year 1852, as appears by her last Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo February 28th 1854 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Bark or Vessel has three masts and one deck and that her length is 79 feet 10 inches, her breadth 29 " 4 " and her depth 12 " 0 " and that she measures 660 tons 38 ninety-fifths that she is a Bark and has

And the said Henry C. Walker and head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Henry C. Walker has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
