In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Wells O. Walbridge Merchant, Buffalo, District of Buffalo Creek Managing Owner
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he is a resident of the City and district aforesaid, and owns individedly the One equal undivided half part of the Propeller called the "Beaumont" of Buffalo, and he together with Nathaniel Walbridge of the same place own the remaining One equal undivided half part of said Propeller as Executors of George W Walbridge deceased late of Buffalo aforesaid and that all said owners, are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Propeller Beaumont of Buffalo whereof Wells O Walbridge is at present Master; and as he hath sworn
John B Dearham is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of New York in the year 1846, as appears by Her Enrollment dated at this port July 26 1852, No 94, now surrendered having changed owners

And the Enrollment having certified that the said Propeller or Vessel has One deck and One mast, and that her length is One Hundred and twenty four feet and nine inches and that her breadth is four feet and seven inches and that her depth is ten feet four and one half inches and that she measures 426 tons 64 ninety-fifths

And the said Wells O Walbridge and No figure head agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Wells O Walbridge has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y.
