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In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Brig Charles Danick or Vessel called the Montath of Buffalo whereof Charles Danick is at present Master; and as he hath sworn

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo in the State of New York in the year 1847, as appears by her last Enrollment dated at this port July 8th 1850 No 62 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 180 feet & 8 inches her breadth 25 " " 10 " her depth 9 " " 4 " and that she measures 281 tons 9 ninety-fifths that she is a Brig and a square stern and a scroll head

And the said Captain H. Bruce having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Charles Danick has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y.
