PORT OF BUFFALO.

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In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Samuel D. Hogg, of Buffalo, New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he is a resident of the City of Buffalo N.Y. and is the Managing Owner of the Schooner Port of Buffalo, and is the owner of the undivided equal 2/3 parts of said vessel that Edward Bennett of Buffalo N.Y. is the owner of the undivided equal 1/3 part thereof, and both of them

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner, Port of Buffalo or Vessel called the Port of Buffalo whereof Edward Bennett is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Madison State of Ohio in the year 1840, as appears by her last enrollment dated at this port 21st April 1853 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and her length is 73 feet (Seventy three feet) and her breadth is 20 " (Twenty feet) and her depth is 7 " 5 inches (Seven feet and five inches) and that she measures (95) Ninety five tons 24 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square stern

And the said Samuel D. Hogg head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
