In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam" passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1850 amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

New York in the year 1854, as appears by her last Enrollment dated  
at this Port April 11th 1854 No 80. Now surrendered  
having changed owner

And the said Enrollment  
the said Schooner - or Vessel has one deck and 2 masts and that  
her length is 132 feet 8 inches  
her breadth 25 " " 9 "  
her depth 10 " " 4 "  
and that she measures 299 tons 82 ninety-fifths  
that she is a Schooner has a square Stern  
and a kroll head

And the said Johnson L. Hall  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with  
the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
