In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 20th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

John Pease of Buffalo, District of Buffalo Creek, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides in said Buffalo and is the Managing owner of the Canal Boat called the "R. H. Heywood" of Buffalo; that said Boat is owned by the firm of John Pease & Co. of Buffalo; and that said firm is composed of the said Pease and Thomas D. Barton who resides at the same place, and said owners are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Canal Boat R. H. Heywood or Vessel called the R. H. Heywood of Buffalo, whereof John D. Thompson is at present Master and as he hath sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Rochester in the State of New York in the year 1854, as appears by the Certificate of Howell & Meyer, Shipwrights, her builders, on file in this office

And P. Hoffman Surveyor having certified that the said Canal Boat or Vessel has One deck and Two masts and that her length is 95 Feet her breadth 16 " her depth 6 " and that she measures 87 tons 87 ninety-fifths that she is a Canal Boat has a square stern and no figure

And the said John Pease head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
