In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Henry C. Walker of Buffalo, New York, managing owner - having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek and is the managing owner of the Brig Sultan of Buffalo and owns one equal undivided half part of said Brig; that Isaac S. Walker of said Buffalo owns the remaining one equal undivided half part of said Brig; and that both are

Citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the said Brig Sultan of Buffalo N. Y. whereof R. Kellogg is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Chicago State of Illinois in the year 1848, as appears by a certified copy of her last enrollment issued at the Port of Chicago dated July 31, 1857 N. Y. B. T., and which is not surrendered, having been lost as appears by the affidavit of Geo. M. Higginson on file in this office -

And the said Enrollment (as appears by the copy thereof) having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 127 feet her breadth 24 " her depth 9 " 4 7/8 inches and that she measures 267 tons ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has no gallery and a billet head

And the said Henry C. Walker having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
