PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and ~~"An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of Aug. 20th 1850, amending the same;~~ also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Meremius Dimick, of Buffalo, in the District of Buffalo Creek, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at said Buffalo and owns one equal undivided third part of the Schooner Robert Bruce of Buffalo and is her managing owner; that Thomas P. Williams resides at Milwaukee in the State of Wisconsin and owns one equal undivided third part of said Schooner; and that the remaining one equal undivided third part of said Schooner is owned by the firm or copartnership doing business at said Buffalo under the firm name of "Bull & Moore" and is composed of ~~Richard~~ ^{Richard} ~~William~~ ^{William} Moore both of Buffalo aforesaid; and that all said owners are Citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner Robert Bruce of Buffalo whereof said Dimick is at present Master; and as he hath sworn Buffalo is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of New York in the year 1854, as appears by her last Enrollment, dated at this Port Sept. 11, 1854 No 180 now surrendered having changed owners.

And Said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 123 feet and 9 inches her breadth 26 " " 2 " her depth 10 " " 6 " and that she measures 312 tons 47 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square stern and no galleries and a scroll head

And the said Meremius Dimick having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y. Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo, in the said District, this 10 day of Sept in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty four.
