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In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on Board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 20th, 1850 amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

George E. Washburn of Buffalo District of Buffalo Creek having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he is the owner of said Buffalo and is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner George or Vessel called the George whereof George Radcliffe of Buffalo is at present Master; and as he hath sworn George Radcliffe of Buffalo is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Dunkirk State of New York in the year 1836 as appears by her last Enrollment dated at this port Apr 25. 1854 No. 91 now surrendered having changed owners.

And said Enrollment has one deck and two masts having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 84 feet her breadth 23 " her depth 9 " and that she measures 153 tons 34 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and Scull head

And the said George E. Washburn having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
