PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and ~~"An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam" passed 7th July, 1829, and the Act of August 20th, 1852, amending the same;~~ also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

Curtis Mann of the City of Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek — having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at said Buffalo, and did at said Buffalo on or about the 1st day of March 1855 as the agent and attorney of Daniel Bradley of the City of Schenectady in the State of New York, purchase in good faith for the said Bradley, the whole of the Schooner Miranda of Buffalo, then being and lying in the Port of Buffalo in said District of Buffalo Creek, and being more than fifty miles distant from said Schenectady by the nearest travelable route; that he still is the agent and attorney of said Bradley in the management of said vessel and that the said Bradley is a

^{residing at said Schenectady}
Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner Miranda of Buffalo N.Y. or Vessel called the Miranda of Buffalo N.Y. whereof H. W. Thorpe is at present Master; and as he hath sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cheloland State of Ohio in the year 1848, as appears by her last Enrollment dated at this port February 22, 1853 No. 10 now surrendered having changed names.

And said Certificate of Enrollment, the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and two masts having certified that her length is 106 feet 11 inches her breadth 23 " her depth 9 " 5 1/4 " and that she measures 217 tons 59 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and a square Stern head having

And the said Curtis Mann agreed to the description and measurements above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y.
