In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1828, and the Act of August 30th, 1850, ~~amending the same~~, also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29, 1850.

John J. Noyes - of Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at said Buffalo and is the Managing owner of the Schooner Flying Dutchman of Buffalo and owns one equal undivided half part thereof; George W. Kelchke resides temporarily at St. Bonaventura Canada West as the agent of the firm of R. Kelchke and Sons of Albany in the State of New York and that both said owners are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owners of the said Schooner or Vessel called the Flying Dutchman whereof J. F. Hitchkiff of Buffalo N. Y. is at present Master; and as he hath sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Fairport State of Ohio in the year 1845, as appears by her last Enrollment issued at this office April 4. 1853 No 59 now surrendered having changed owners -

And Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 80 feet 9 inches her breadth 19 " 2 " her depth 5 " 4 " and that she measures 749 tons 49 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and no head

And the said John J. Noyes having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N Y. Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo, in the said District, this 22<sup>d</sup> day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty six -
