## District of Buffalo Creek, PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29 1850.

Willes Hawes of Bridgeport, Connecticut  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at said Bridgeport and is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner  
P. P. Pratt of Buffalo N. Y. whereof George Kesteliff  
is at present Master; and as he has sworn  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of  
New York in the year 1848, as appears by her last Enrollment dated at this  
port April 24, 1852 - No. 50 now surrendered having changed  
owners

And said Enrollment  
the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that  
her length is 114 feet 1 inches  
her breadth 21 feet 1/2 inches  
her depth 8 feet 1 9/16 inches  
and that she measures 196 tons 00 ninety-fifths  
that she is a Schooner has a scroll head.

And the said Willes Hawes  
having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
