## District of Buffalo Creek, PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, ~~and also an act~~; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29 1850.

Harvey M. Miser and Leander W. Miser  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that they reside at Buffalo  
in the District of Buffalo Creek and are

Citizens of the United States, and ~~the~~ owners of the one equal undivided half part of the  
Schooner called the "Golden Harvest" of Buffalo, whereof Lyman Cook of Buffalo  
is at present Master; and as he has sworn  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo, State of  
New York in the year 1855, as appears by the Certificate of B. B. James  
Shipwright her builder on file in this office

And James G. Pattison  
the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts, and that  
her length is - 131 - feet - 8 - inches  
her breadth - 28 - feet - 4 - inches  
her depth - 11 - feet - inches  
and that she measures 376 tons 17 - ninety-fifths  
that she is a Schooner has a square stern/  
and scull - no figure - head.

And the said Harvey M. Miser  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with  
the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner  
has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
