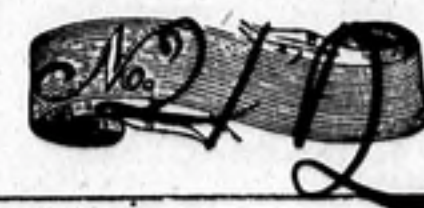




# ENROLLMENT.



## District of Buffalo Creek, PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the ~~same~~; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29 1850.

Henry C. Walker -

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo and is President of the Lake Navigation Company of Buffalo a corporation accepted at said Buffalo organized under the laws of the State New York that said company is the ~~sole~~

~~Citizen of the United States~~ and sole owner of the Schooner called the Mimi Winnie of Buffalo whereof John Eastwick is at present Master; and as he has sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo New York in the year 1856, as appears by the certificate of her last Enrollment dated at this Port October 11, 1856 No. 198 now surrendered having changed owners -

And the said certificate having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has ~~been~~ deck and two masts and that her length is 122 feet 5 inches her breadth 26 feet 5 inches her depth 10 feet 8 inches and that she measures 310 tons 58 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and has a square stern and an eagle figure head.

And the said H. C. Walker Port Buffalo having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.

Given under my hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo, in the said District, this 17 day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty 6.
