



ENROLLMENT.



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District of Buffalo Creek, PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29 1850.

Olijah K. Bruce
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek and is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Brig called the *Hampton* of Buffalo whereof he is at present Master; and as he has sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Prinsdusa* New York in the year 1845, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment dated at this Port July 31, 1850, now surrendered having changed owners - No 174 is a State of

And said Certificate - the said Brig or Vessel has one deck and two masts, and that her length is 113 feet 6 inches her breadth 24 feet inches her depth 9 feet 6 inches and that she measures 238 tons 76 ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has a square stern and scroll head.

And the said *Olijah K. Bruce* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
