PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29 1850.

Henry Fitzhugh -
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Oswego N.Y and that I will G. Littlejohn resides at the same place, and that they on the 12th day of May 1857 purchased the Propeller Buffalo N.Y the Propeller Burlington she then and till being at said Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek which is more than 50 miles distant from Oswego by the most direct route that they are both

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Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the ^{each 1/2 part undivided of the said Propeller} called the Burlington of Buffalo whereof said Fitzhugh is at present Master; and as he has sworn
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo in the year 1857, as appears by the certificate of his last Enrollment dated at this Port May 12, 1857 No. 66 - now surrendered having changed owners -

And I do certify -
the said Propeller or Vessel has one deck and one mast, and that
her length is 137 feet 4 inches
her breadth 25 feet 6 inches
her depth 11 feet 9 inches
and that she measures 384 tons 74 - ninety-fifths
that she is a Propeller has a square stern head.

And the said Henry Fitzhugh -
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Propeller has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
