



ENROLLMENT.



District of Buffalo Creek, PORT OF BUFFALO.

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th 1852, amending the same also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th 1850.

R. R. Johnson -
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo Dist. of Buffalo Creek - and owns $\frac{2}{3}$ parts undivided of the Brig Acadia of Buffalo, that Isaac N. Fisher resides at said Buffalo and owns the remaining $\frac{1}{3}$ part undivided of said Brig, and they both are Citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the said Brig called the Acadia of Buffalo whereof *Geo. Pirson* is at present Master; and as he has sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Brownsville, New York in the year 1847, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment dated at this Port February 25, 1857 now surrendered having changed owners -

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 119 feet 9 inches her breadth 25 feet 9 inches her depth 10 feet 5 inches and that she measures 389 tons 75 ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has a square stern and no figure head.

And the said Rufus R. Johnson and *Geo. Pirson* agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
