In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th 1852, amending the same, also an act entitled "An act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th 1850.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo in the District of Buffalo Creek, New York, and is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner "Corinthian" of Buffalo, whereof he is Master; and as he has sworn is at present Master; and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Irving New York in the year 1856, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment dated at this Port August 5th 1858, No. 96, the certificate of which has been lost as appears from the affidavit of Andrew J. Rich, her former owner, on file in this office.

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and Two masts and that her length is 136 feet 6 inches her breadth 26 feet 2 inches her depth 11 feet 1 inch and that she measures Three hundred sixty eight tons 83 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square stern and no figure head.

And the said G. W. Piff agreed to the description and dimensions above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.
