In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 20th, 1852, amending the same; also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July, 29th, 1850.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said acts, and having sworn that he resides at Lockport N.Y. And is a

Citizen of the United States and sole owner of the Schooner Maria F. Johnson  
of Buffalo whereof Jas. H. Lottis is at present Master; and as he has sworn is a

Citizen of the United States and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo  
State of New York in the year 1857, as appears by her Enrollment dated  
at this Port Oct 14th 1859 numbered 127 now surrendered  
having changed Owners.

And said Enrollment  
the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and Two masts and that  
her length is 121 feet 3 inches  
her breadth 25 feet 10 inches  
her depth 10 feet 0 inches  
and that she measures Two hundred & eighty seven tons - 49 - ninety-fifths  
that she is a Schooner has a Square stern  
and Scull head

And the said D. A. Van Valkenburgh  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with  
the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
