Each of our half part Citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner Invincible of Buffalo whereof John Hudnot is at present Master; and as he has sworn that he is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of New York in the year 1857 as appears by the Certificate of his former Enrollment at this Port dated the 16th day of September 1859 numbered 101 - now surrendered having changed owners

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 136 feet inches her breadth 30 feet inches her depth 11 feet inches and that she measures Two Hundred & thirty seven tons Eighty ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square steam head. And the said John B. Griffin and no figure having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
