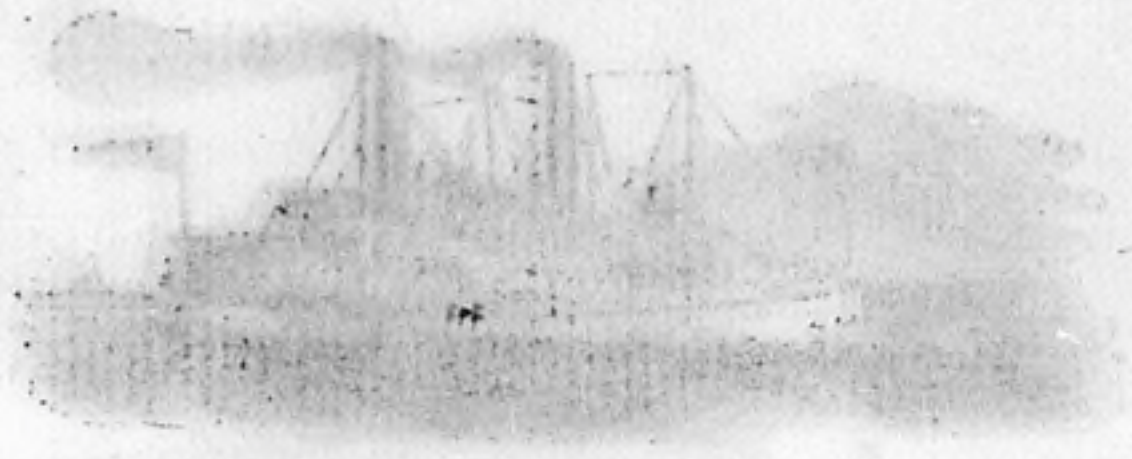

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c." passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to Provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1850, amending the same; also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th, 1850,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N.Y. and owns one eighth (1/8<sup>th</sup>), that Jesse Hoyt resides at New York and owns three fourths (3/4<sup>th</sup>) and that Charles Clark, resides at Jersey City, and owns one eighth (1/8<sup>th</sup>), and that they all are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Barque Newsboy of Buffalo  
whereof James E. Muir is at present Master; and as he has sworn he

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at East Saginaw State of Michigan in the year 1862, as appears by the Certificate of her Temporary Enrollment at the Port of Milwaukee, dated April 21<sup>st</sup> 1864 and numbered "73", now surrendered, having arrived at her home port

And said Enrollment the said Barque or vessel has one deck and three masts and that her length is 152 feet 6 inches her breadth 31 feet inches her depth 12 feet 9 inches and that she measures Five Hundred and fifty seven tons eight ninety-fifths that she is a Barque has a elliptic stern head and eagle

And the said James R. Bentley agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Barque has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo, in the said District, this 6<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
