he is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of New York in the year 1855, as appears by the Certificate of her Temporary Enrollment at the Port of Milwaukee, dated April 19. 1864, and numbered "69", now surrendered, having arrived at home port

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 137 feet - 8 - inches her breadth 26 feet - 8 - inches her depth 10 feet - 10 - inches and that she measures Three Hundred fifty seven tons eighty two ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square stern head.

And the said Augustus C. Taylor and no figure having agreed to the description and measurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
