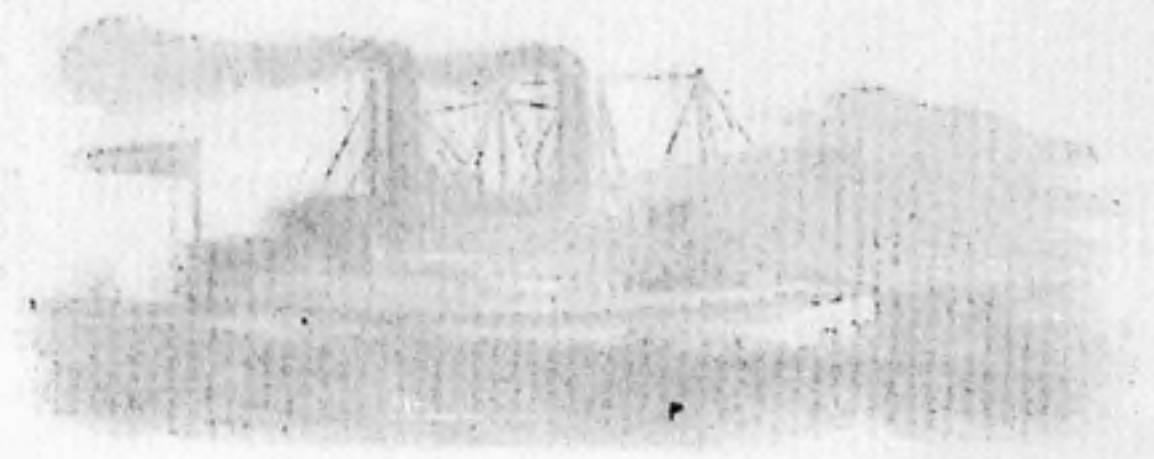

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c." passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to Provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th, 1850,

Fred. G. Rotan

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Philadelphia Pa and that he is the Agent for Samuel Rotan, who resides at the same place and is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Tug Propeller Sam Rotan of Philadelphia whereof Fred G Rotan is at present Master; and as he has sworn he is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo State of New York in the year 1864 as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated October 15th 1864 and numbered 242 now surrendered having changed Owners

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Tug Prop or vessel has one deck and no mast and that her length is 55 feet 9 inches her breadth 14 feet 5 inches her depth 6 feet inches and that she measures Forty three (43) tons 8 ninety-fifths that she is a Tug Propeller has a round stern head.

And the said Fred G Rotan no figure having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Tug Prop has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
